ACADEMIC AND/OR TEACHING UNIT REVIEW GUIDELINES FOR APPENDICES

The appendices should be submitted electronically or on a storage device (DVD, thumb drive, etc.) The data collected in coordination with the Office of Institutional Research and Assessment are indicated in italics.

A. Appendices for Overview

- 1. Organizational chart of the academic and/or teaching unit
- 2. Any documents that would address the governance of the academic and/or teaching unit (*e.g.*, program bylaws, decision making authority and voting rights in the unit, etc.)
- 3. Academic and/or teaching unit mission, goals, and strategic plan (as applicable)
- 4. Benchmarking and other comparison information and data
- 5. Relevant data for unit "snapshot"

For the following sections, all data included should cover a period of the past seven years, if available.

B. Appendices for Faculty

- 1. List of tenure-line faculty by rank, tenure status, gender, ethnicity, and major areas of expertise
- 2. List of multi-year term and in-residence faculty by rank, gender, ethnicity, and areas of expertise (1 and 2 may be combined and marked appropriately)
- 3. A table of the total number of tenure-line, full-time, and adjunct faculty over time
- 4. New faculty hired within the past seven years and their current status
- 5. Tenure-line faculty who have left the university
- 6. List of faculty instructional workload
- 7. List faculty publications, creative works, patents, and other scholarly activities (the faculty vitae may substitute for this information)
- 8. Sources of faculty support to include PI, percentage of effort, and funding received
- 9. Sponsored activity, including the number of proposals submitted, the total dollar value of the submissions, the number of awards, and the dollar value of the awards
- 10. Highlights of faculty awards, honors, and recognitions
- 11. Highlights of significant faculty service to the college/school, university, or external communities on behalf of the university
- 12. Attach copies of abbreviated vitae for all current tenure-line, in-residence, and multi-year term faculty
- 13. Diversity and inclusion pertaining to faculty development

C. Appendices for Educational Programs – Undergraduate Education

- 1. Student majors (primary and secondary), minors, and other enrollments over the past seven years shown in a table
- 2. Student majors by race, gender, and ethnicity over the past seven years shown in a table.
- 3. Retention and graduation rates for undergraduate majors for both "native" and transfer students over the past seven years shown in a table
- 4. Undergraduate degree productivity (degrees conferred for primary majors) over the past seven years

- 5. Information, as available, of student experiences as evidenced in the most recent university surveys such as NSSE, Campus Climate, and Graduation Census
- 6. Evidence of student success, including awards, merit scholarships, honors, graduate school outcomes, and employment outcomes, if available
- 7. Description and curriculum for each undergraduate academic program housed in the unit
- 8. Undergraduate learning outcomes assessment plans and reports for each undergraduate program housed in the unit
- 9. List of all General Education, University Honors, and University College courses offered by the unit, as applicable
- 10. Sample listing of primarily undergraduate co-curricular activities or events sponsored by the unit (lectures, readings, performances, etc.)

D. Appendices for Educational Programs: Graduate Education

- 1. Numbers of post-baccalaureate, masters, and doctoral enrollments of full- and part-time students over the past seven years shown in a table
- 2. Number of enrolled students by race, gender, and ethnicity over the past seven years shown in a table
- 3. Statistics on graduate student applicants, admissions, and matriculations over the past seven years, shown in a table
- 4. Retention and time to degree for master's and doctoral students over the past seven years, shown in a table
- 5. Information, as available, of student experiences as evidenced in the most university surveys such as NSSE, Campus Climate, and Graduation Census
- 6. Evidence of student success, including awards, fellowships, honors, publications, performances, placements, etc.
- 7. Graduate learning outcomes assessment plans and reports for each graduate program housed in the unit
- 8. Titles of master's theses and PhD titles and abstracts
- 9. Description and curriculum for each graduate program housed in the unit
