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PREFACE

The Office of Institutional Research is pleased to present the 40th edition of the *Academic Data Reference Book* (ADRB). The current addition joins 39 previous issues to form a continuum of information about academic aspects of American University. In 1971 the ADRB was described as an “experimental ‘first edition’ designed to meet many of the recurring requests concerning enrollment, entering freshman classes, retention rates, degrees conferred, average course size, and number of faculty”. This goal has been met every year since, evolving along the way. In the early years of the publication, tables were compiled using data reports generated from a large mainframe computer. The office had no direct access to the data and had little flexibility in how it presented information. Now, OIRA has direct access to data and the ADRB is only one of many resources for those interested in knowing more about American University.

DEFINITIONS

Abroad at AU	Program for students from other countries who want to study at AU for a limited period of time, usually a year or a semester. Students can receive a certificate but this is generally not a degree-seeking program.
AU Abroad	Program for students studying abroad in an AU sponsored program, (formerly the World Capitals Program.)
Census Date	The day on which AU takes a snapshot of student data to ensure consistent reporting for each semester. The fall and spring census dates are at the end of the fifth week of classes for those semesters. The summer census date is the same as the fall census date. All enrollment reporting is as of the census date.
Eagledata	Web-accessible source for university statistics and reports.
Full-time	Undergraduate degree seeking, nondegree and certificate students and law students taking 12 or more credit hours, and graduate degree-seeking, nondegree and certificate students taking 9 or more credit hours.
Full-time Equivalent	The number of full-time students, plus the total student credits hours of part-time students divided by the minimum number of credits to be considered a full-time student at the same academic level.
Law	Includes all students in the Washington College of Law, including JD, LL.M, SJD, nondegree and certificate.
Maintaining Matriculation	The enrollment status of graduate students not registered for courses, or thesis / dissertation credits, whose degree requirements have not yet been completed, in order to continue enrollment.
Nondegree	Students enrolled in regular university courses who have not been admitted to a degree program. Unless otherwise noted, excludes law.
Part-time	Undergraduate degree seeking, nondegree and certificate students and law students taking fewer than 12 credit hours, and graduate degree-seeking, nondegree and certificate students taking fewer than 9 credit hours.
Student Credit Hours	The sum of the credit hours per student course registration.

Visiting	Students from other institutions studying through AU. Includes Non-AU AU Abroad, Abroad at AU and Washington Semester, but excludes Washington Mentorship.
Washington Mentorship	15-credit fall semester program designed specifically for students admitted as spring freshmen.
Washington Semester	A one-semester intercollegiate program for non-AU students.
