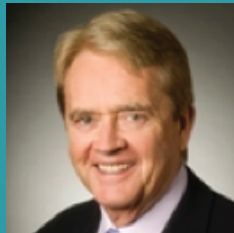
Private-Public Financing for Global Sustainability

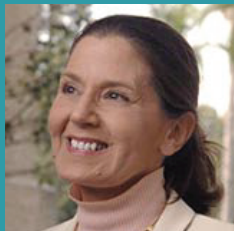

Lynn Scarlett: serves as the Global Managing Director for Public Policy at The Nature Conservancy. In this role, she influences climate and nature-based solutions policy—in the United States and the 69 countries in which the Conservancy influences conservation.



Terry Tamminen: co-founder of the R20 Regions of Climate Action, a new public-private partnership focused on implementing measurable and climate resilient economic development projects that can simultaneously solve the climate crisis and build a sustainable global economy.
