Discussion Recap

Welcome and President Jonathan Alger's Remarks

- Donzell Robinson welcomed everyone.
- Matthew Bennett introduced President Jonathan Alger, who joined AU in July.
 - Pres. Jonathan Alger provided his personal history and connection to Washington, DC and the community.
 - Discussed his initiatives and experience at JMU in engaging neighbors and maintaining relationships with the Harrisonburg community.
 - Shared that AU has a new athletics director and that he wants to encourage neighbors to come to AU events.
 Emphasized his belief that the more comfortable the community is with being on campus and the more comfortable students feel in the community, the better off everyone will be.
 - Provided insight on the civic life initiative that has already started. This initiative will be incorporated into a curriculum and speaker series, will focus on civic engagement and civil discourse
 - Shared that he is doing a listening tour on and off campus to get as much feedback as possible for hopes and dreams for the university.
- Questions:
- A member asked how do you think you will interact with the community and make sure everyone is heard and incorporated?
- Pres. Alger said he's learning the established mechanisms and operations to hear the feedback from the community. He is looking to promote win-win decisions.
- A member asked about challenges he experienced working with the community and his thought process for solutions.
- Pres. Alger said being responsible for student's behavior when they don't live on campus. He gave an example that during COVID, JMU worked with local landlords to communicate with off-campus students. JMU also invested in learning about being good neighbors and educating students on their responsibilities and rights.
- A member explained what started the partnership and how the partnership should be more than discussing facilities of the university.

Coordinated on back-to-school post card to neighbors to ensure the effectiveness and increased the reach of the post cards to the neighbors Highlighted how the student conduct reporting process works and that there are very few repeat incidents Off-campus orientation has been extended to the 20007 zip code Josh Finver provided the Transportation and Parking working group report: o DDOT reviewed the Urban Forestry concerns for the Capital Bikeshare, and it will not impact any trees. Scooter partnership, parking enforcement, and high campus activity day. A member asked if the student orientation includes scooter rules and alerting pedestrians. • The fall transportation newsletter to students does cover scooter rules and safety. • A member asked if there are designated pick-up and drop-off for rideshare vehicles. • Josh stated that there are four, including one on East Campus, South Campus and one on Nebraska. • A member reminded AU that the building where OLLI has classes now requires a code to access the parking area. Josh said he would work with Tony to see if they can have an

attendant to help them with entry.

Members asked if the transportation newsletter could be sent monthly.
