



Trust in the local media remains higher than trust in the national media




Data come from the 2017 Cooperative Congressional Election Study. Figures represent percentage of respondents giving positive response.

Democrats express far more trust in the national media than Republicans do





The partisan gap is smaller for local media, but Democrats express more trust than Republicans




