Carie Cameron is the Director of the Fair-Trade Practices Program's, Warehouse and Commodity Management Division (WCMD). In this capacity, Carie is responsible for leading the Division's two offices in Washington, D. C. and Kansas City, Missouri, as well as the approximate 40 warehouse examiners located in resident duty stations throughout the United States. WCMD is responsible for administrating an array of programs under the authority of the United States Warehouse Act, Commodity Credit Corporation Charter Act, and various direct payment programs and price support programs established in the Farm Bill.Carie began her career with the USDA in 2002. Over the course of the last 20 years, she has worked within the Division in various capacities. She was hired initially as Warehouse Examiner with duty stations in Indiana and Illinois. Carie left government service for a brief period and worked for a commodity brokerage firm in Chicago focusing on producer risk management. She was fortunate to return to the USDA and into the same Division as she left. Carie's childhood was very formative to her career path. She spent her early years on a dairy and row crop farm in Central Kansas. Later, her parents relocated the family and operated their logistics company (refrigerated products) to Northwest Missouri.
